# STORYTELLING for TEACHING and LEARNING A Storytelling Toolbox for Teachers and Educators

Dublin (IRELAND)

### WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This course is designed for **teachers and educators** interested in using Storytelling tools to enhance their students' learning through a meaningful and effective way of teaching. **Language teachers** as well as **Subject teachers** will discover and experience a variety of inclusive Storytelling techniques and tools that will enrich their teaching portfolio of resources to cater for different **subjects, learning abilities** and the **multiple sensory needs** of their students.

Language of communication: **English**

Minimum Level of English required: **B2+**

Participants should be **teachers and educators** with a minimum level of English corresponding to **B2+** in the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR).

### COURSE DESCRIPTION

#### **Increase motivation, participation, and active learning in all types of classes!**

A good storyteller will become a skillful communicator in the future — Storytelling is a skill students and teachers need in today's world. Through Storytelling, students can better learn to describe scientific phenomena as well as places and events, and express relevant and meaningful points of view and conclusions. Storytelling not only strengthens writing and speaking skills, but also improves the logical organisation of ideas and the acquisition of knowledge, both in language subjects and in core subjects such as History, Geography, Science, Maths...

For teachers, mastering Storytelling techniques means unlocking endless opportunities to engage students, introduce concepts naturally, and stimulate both imagination and critical thinking in the real world.

#### **What makes this course special?**

Stories are at the foundation of human learning: they spark our curiosity, help us build emotional connections, make information more accessible, and help us understand the world on an unforgettable journey toward knowledge. Whether you are explaining linguistic structures, or scientific phenomena, or historical milestones, Storytelling and an inclusive multisensorial approach to learning will help your students connect ideas and help you teach with greater clarity and impact.

Adding Storytelling techniques to your teaching repertoire will unlock your students' curiosity, emotion, and motivation in the classroom — creating a meaningful and lasting impact on their learning journey. This course should empower teachers to become designers of innovative, unique and inclusive multisensorial learning experiences for their students.



## OBJECTIVES

The **specific objectives** of this programme are:

- To experience and reflect on the practices of Storytelling as a powerful tool for teaching and learning, by incorporating Storytelling techniques and tools into the classroom
- To enable participants design multisensory learning sequences to increase students' motivation
- To stimulate the creative potential of participants for pedagogical purposes
- To enhance participants' communicative competence in English by providing opportunities to interact with colleagues of other nationalities

## METHODOLOGY

This **course for teachers** employs a comprehensive, interactive, and practical methodology designed to foster creativity, cultural immersion, critical thinking, and collaborative learning.

### How will the learning happen?

**Skills and attitudes:** Participants will develop confidence through embodiment and physical storytelling techniques which will teach how you can bring abstract concepts to life. You will develop a creative and adaptable mindset when co-creating cross-curricular stories (e.g., blending History with Science, or Geography with Language and Literature, or Art with Maths) to model cooperative learning and Storytelling activities with students.

**Practical Storytelling workshops** will help participants focus on key Storytelling elements: the *Storyteller and the audience*, the *three-stage setting of Storytelling...* and create, adapt, and tell stories for the teaching and learning of linguistic and non-linguistic subjects.

**Multisensory learning** will help teachers and educators design learning sequences around stories while including as many senses as possible as well as different learning styles and abilities. This will enhance motivation and understanding of complex concepts while making learning fun, exciting and memorable.

**Toolbox and resources:** participants will be able take back to their classrooms a portfolio of resources on Storytelling. The use of practical strategies such as *Story Circle Sessions*, *Storytelling Challenges*, *Digital Storytelling*, or *Fold and Tell* techniques will enable participants to create a Storytelling toolbox that can be tailored and adapted to their own unique learning environment.

**Field Learning Projects ('Contexts4Content')** to emphasise context-based and experiential learning, implemented by exploring cultural and historical landmarks to design storytelling-based lessons around authentic materials and create a richer and more engaging learning experience.

**European dimension** awareness through **Collaborative Story Building** and **Multilingual Storytelling**, as well as through the field work activities.

The main expectation of the course, however, will be the willingness of the participants to enter the spirit of the programme and the cultural framework that Ireland represents.



## LOCATION OF THE COURSE: Dublin (IRELAND)

**Ireland** has a very rich and longstanding tradition of oral storytelling, passed down through generations from ancient times. You will enjoy the Irish myths and legends and will find inspiration in the people of Ireland, their weather, and folklore.

**Dublin** is an old medieval Viking city that displays a fascinating panorama on its streets through a pleasant mix of historic buildings and sites, monuments and street art. Trinity College and the unique Book of Kells, Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin's Viking Castle, the remarkable Chester Beatty Library, or the Samuel Becket Bridge, can be discovered at the same time as Sweny's pharmacy (immortalized in Joyce's Ulysses), where a surprising mix of second-hand books and lemon-scented soap can be found together.

**Dublin** is also a warm and welcoming city. Its enjoyable "craic" has attracted visitors for centuries. Traditional music is extremely popular in Ireland and is so easy to find a pub where a band is playing some good drinking music while customers happily join in the chorus.

## DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**. / 10-day course: **60 hours**.

Our **7-day course**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday, is a very efficient way to implement your mobility by integrating your learning while saving time and expenses. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons, in connection with the "Quality standards for courses under Erasmus+ KA1"

Our **10-day course** is held in summertime when participants can implement their mobility with more time to learn about the content of the programme. The **60 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons, in connection with the "Quality standards for courses under Erasmus+ KA1".

## CERTIFICATION AWARDED

Certification of learning outcomes in connection with the "Quality standards for courses under Erasmus+ KA1": Europass and Certificate of Attendance which include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates, venues, the name of the host organisation and course director.
